



## NOOK for the Classroom

-We have 50 NOOKs available for classroom use (either whole group or small groups)

-NOOKs can be loaded with any book offered in the NOOK format from B&N. If there is a book you are interested in, let me know and we can order it.

### Student Use Guidelines:

-NOOKs must remain in their covers at all times

-Each student should be assigned a specific NOOK to use for the duration of the book (numbers are on the back of the covers, example 7-2)

-The screen is the most vulnerable part, students should be taught to be careful not to poke/scratch it

-Students should not place anything heavy on the NOOK

-NOOKs should not leave the school building

-NOOKs can go several weeks before needing to be charged (return to me when low battery and I will charge it)



### Basic NOOK handling:

-To wake up your NOOK, press the raised N on the bottom and then slide your finger across the bottom of the screen

-To access books on the NOOK once it is awake, press the N on the bottom and then select Library. Tap on the book you'd like to read

-To find a specific page within a book, tap the center of the screen and then select Contents or select Go To (for a specific page number)

-To change the font size or line spacing within a book, tap the center of the screen and then select Text

-To use the included dictionary to look up a word, put your finger on the word and hold it for a few seconds until another menu shows up along the bottom. Select Look Up to see the definition

-To turn to the next page, tap the right side of the screen, or press either of the TOP raised bars beside the screen (pressing either of the bottom two bars takes the book back one page)



-Students need to be patient as the response time is slower than an iPad/iPod. After tapping the screen, students should wait a couple of seconds before tapping again.
